COLORADO HERITAGE JOURNEY

Alongside Sangre de Cristo and South Park National Heritage Areas , PHA worked with the Colorado Tourism Office to create a new landing page, brochure, and marketing plan that highlights the importance of heritage tourism throughout the state.

CENTENNIAL VILLAGE WINDMILL

PHA funded the restoration and interpretation of a historic windmill and part of the Ditch No. 3 headgate at the Centennial Village Museum in Greeley. This project helps tell the story of water in Northern Colorado.




NATURE RIDES

Nature Rides is a new educational program that connects youth from The Boys and Girls Club to nature in Fort Collins. PHA's support of this program allowed participants to learn about the local watershed and ecology through hands-on activities with educators and experts.

HERITAGE TRAIL

As part of the whitewater park construction near Downtown Fort Collins, PHA will be creating iconography and interpretative displays that tell the story of the Poudre River as it relates to agriculture, industry, and recreation. This icongraphy will extend the length of the Heritage Area.
