Through the **Learning in Our Watershed** program, the Poudre Heritage Alliance provides grant funds to K-12 school teachers in Larimer and Weld County to hire buses and pay entry fees to bring students on field trips to the Cache la Poudre River National Heritage Area (CALA).

Pedaling the Poudre™ biking adventures are original and engaging rides that explore the Cache la Poudre River National Heritage Area's (CALA) fascinating landmarks and landscapes. The Poudre Heritage Alliance offers a range of guided historical bike tours that are comfortable for cyclists of all experience levels in both Larimer and Weld Counties. The Poudre River is a great recreation corridor because of the bike path that follows the river for 30+ miles from the foothills to the confluence with the South Platte near Greeley.



# THE POUDRE RIVER FLOWS THROUGH COLORADO'S HISTORY

The Cache la Poudre River National Heritage Area (CALA) follows 45 miles of the lower "working Cache" through Fort Collins, Windsor, Greeley and beyond. Through the **Heritage Trails** program we are creating cohesive branding, storytelling and visitor wayfinding throughout the river corridor. Interpretive signs and viewing areas next to the river will enable visitors to understand more clearly the messages of history, the environment, or a nearly forgotten culture.


Our first Heritage Trail marker and gateway, located at the Poudre River Whitewater Park, was funded in 2019 and installed in June 2020. They both speak to the history and importance of the Coy Ditch headgate and diversion structure, which led to the first in-channel water right in Colorado.


### SMALL & LARGE GRANT PROGRAM


## AN EDUCATIONAL CELEBRATION OF THE POURE RIVER




