


Explore the Farmers Markets

The Greeley Philharmonic performed a symphonic cultural demonstration that paid tribute to Greeley's rich Chicano & Latino cultures through a program celebrating Día de los Muertos. 70 professional musicians performed nine movements that celebrated Chicano and Latino Heritage for an audience of **584**.

✓ Poudre Runs Through It

Poudre Runs Through It (PRTI) is a study action group of regional leaders and experts who reflect the diverse values of those who live and work in the communities along the Cache la Poudre River. Some members value the river as a working river for agriculture, municipality, and industrial needs, while others value recreation and ecological attributes. The group uses its experiences and knowledge to identify opportunities for cooperative action.

★ Did you know? The Poudre River Forum planning committee is made up of PRTI members. Topics for the forum often stem from study topics explored with PRTI.

✓ Native Seed & Plant Swap

The NoCo Native Plant Exchange hosts two annual events: a native plant swap and giveaway in June and a native seed swap in November. Through these events, the NoCo Native Plant Exchange empowers the community to use locally native plants in their landscapes to support wildlife, conserve water and share educational resources. This year 960 plants were donated and 150 native species of seeds were collected and distributed. **830** people attended the Native Seed & Swap events in 2025.



✓ Poudre RiverFest

Poudre RiverFest invites the community to experience the Cache la Poudre River, while promoting restoration and educating people about the river corridor. This free, family-friendly festival brings people together to celebrate the river through exhibitors and hands-on activities all connected to the river. In 2025, the festival welcomed **2,700** attendees who enjoyed live music from local bands and a vibrant community atmosphere of people who love the Poudre River.

The Cache NHA has supported the festival since its inception, serving on the planning committee and hosting a booth featuring an interactive magnet map. Visitors explored historic photo collections from across the heritage area, gaining a deeper sense of place and connection to the river.

01 Pub Talks

Poudre Pub Talks, funded by Nutrien, is an annual educational series that bring experts to your favorite local breweries for informational conversations about our community's culture, history, recreation, ecology, and stewardship.



From November 2024 to February 2025, Cache NHA hosted a series of four Pub Talks. Over **246** people learned about the following topics:

02 Poudre River Forum

The Poudre River Forum is a conference on water issues, use, history, and conservation practices. Over **228** people attended the 10th Anniversary Forum which focused on the Poudre River basin, reflecting on its historic past, the evolutionary path to the present, and considerations for future generations. Of those in attendance, there were 6 legislators. The 49 survey respondents gave the event an overall score of 4.5/5 with top comments focusing on the great venue, high quality speakers, and the diversity of viewpoints.

03 Learning In Our Watershed™

Learning in Our Watershed™ (LOIW) is a field trip program designed to help youth understand the Cache la Poudre River and their water heritage while inspiring the next generation of river stewards. In 2025, **8,086** students participated in LOIW field trips within the national heritage area. Total program costs are \$237,800+ and funding is provided by the National Park Foundation, Nutrien, and private donations.

Emeritus Board Members

Emeritus board members are individuals who have served the Poudre Heritage Alliance and the Cache la Poudre River National Heritage Area with distinction, excellence, and outstanding service.

This year's honoree was Dr. Robert Ward. Robert served as Director of the Colorado Water Center from 1991–2005 and as a PHA board member from 2001–2016.

Board members describe Robert as always thoughtful, collaborative, and passionate about the NHA and his enthusiasm for history is remarkable. Robert has shared his knowledge of Western water development as told through the lives of various individuals linked to the Poudre River at the Poudre River Forum, Pedaling the Poudre Tours, and more.



Poudre Pioneer

The Poudre Pioneer Award recognizes individuals who have remarkably contributed toward furthering the PRTI goal to make the Cache la Poudre River a premier example of a healthy working river.



This year's awardee was John Stokes. John retired from the City of Fort Collins in 2021 and for most of his time there he led the Natural Areas Department. During his tenure, conserved lands grew from approximately 9,000 acres to over 50,000 acres. John and his colleagues worked to improve the Poudre River via physical improvements, water rights transactions, and partnership building. "For all of us who care for and love the Poudre River, we know what a precious and fragile resource that we depend on for vital ecological, agricultural, industrial and domestic purposes," said Stokes.



New Headquarters

✓ B.H. Eaton House

This year the Cache NHA relocated its headquarters to the historic B.H. Eaton House in Windsor. From Memorial Day to Labor Day, the site was open on the weekends as a visitor center. During our first summer we welcomed **1,198** visitors, providing tourist information and interpretations of the heritage area's history.
